

















NSW Road Toll Progress – preliminary provisional data as at 1 January 2018









392 fatalities on NSW roads up until midnight 31 December 2017, **12** (3 per cent) more than the same period last year. This equates to 4.99 deaths per 100,000 population up from 4.91 in 2016. Sydney Metropolitan area down 9 (92 fatalities). Rest of NSW up 21 (300).
